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SURVEY BACKGROUND AND SUMMARY

The Indiana University Southeast Alumni Survey was created in 2012 to obtain data necessary for the Office of Institutional Effectiveness (OIE), the Office of Development, and the Career Development Center. The instrument- found in Appendix A of this report-collects information pertaining to employment, graduate education, preparation for after college, perception of IU Southeast, satisfaction with the college experience, and updated contact information.

Respondents for the 2018 survey administration were drawn from institution records of degree recipients and included alumni from the following graduation classes:

- May 2017, August 2017 and December 2017 graduates (One year out)
- > 2014-2015 graduates (Three years out)
- > 2012-2013 graduates (Five years out; previously surveyed three years out in 2017)

Response rates of the various graduation classes are below. Further demographic details of the respondents are found in the original Alumni Survey reports on the OIE webpage.

EMPLOYMENT & INCOME

Since graduating from IU Southeast, the large majority of responding alumni have accepted a full-time position. Five respondents have not accepted a full-time position; of them, four are employed part-time and one is unemployed for personal reasons and seeking work.

Only four percent of respondents who have accepted a full-time position did so prior to their graduation from IU Southeast; however, 65% accepted their position within six months of graduation. An additional 26% accepted more than twelve months after graduation.

CO-CURRICULAR ACTIVITY

The large majority of Education respondents (64%) consistently worked while attending IU Southeast, with equal numbers of respondents working between 11 and 20 hours, between 21 and 30 hours, and more than 30 hours per week. More than a third of respondents did not work at all.

PREPAREDNESS

The majority of responding alumni felt prepared by their IU Southeast education; however, contributing to the community received a "fair preparation" response of 12%; furthering education received a "fair preparation" response rate of 20%; finding a job using skills developed in major received a "fair preparation" response rate of 16%; preparation for current career received a "fair preparation" response rate of 20%; and finding a job in studied field received a "fair preparation" response rate of 20%. The last three preparation areas also had "poor preparation" response rates of 8%.

Two-thirds (67%) of undergraduate Elementary Education alumni achieved at least one of the recognized advancements within 2 years of completing an IU Southeast degree; 33% achieved two or more; and three respondents achieved all three.

IU SOUTHEAST EDUCATION & EXPERIENCE

All of the questions regarding education at IU Southeast received high marks from survey respondents, and disagreement was low. Alumni reported the lowest agreement with having received a richer academic experience at IU Southeast than elsewhere and feeling like a member of the IU Southeast community; both statements received "neutral" response rates of 24%.

Levels of satisfaction with emphasized aspects of the IU Southeast experience were also high in most areas. However, 16% of respondents felt "neutral" about the quality of information about career and job opportunities; an additional 16% felt "dissatisfied" or "very dissatisfied." Thirty-six percent of respondents also felt "neutral" about the opportunities to be involved in extracurricular activities.

SCHOOL OF EDUCATION SPECIFIC QUESTIONS

The large majority of responding Education alumni also felt well prepared in sixteen critical areas relating to their field. The alumni who were three years from their IU Southeast graduation had unanimous agreement ratings for all 16 categories. The preparation statements with the lowest levels of agreement were "IUS prepared me to be a high-quality educator," "IUS prepared me to be a professional who brings new ideas and skills to the school," and "IUS prepared me to apply classroom management procedures." These three statements all had "neither agree nor disagree" response rates of 14%.

QUALITATIVE COMMENTS: RECOMMEND IUS

Respondents were asked, "Will you recommend IUS to others who wish to pursue teaching? Why or why not?"

The process of gaining admittance to the program and later getting my teacher's license was an unnecessarily stressful ordeal I wouldn't wish on anyone.

QUALITATIVE COMMENTS: OTHER STRENGTHS/WEAKNESSES

Respondents were asked, "If there are any other strengths or weaknesses of your program that you would like to address, please do so."

- 1. There should be a way for students to evaluate their advisors, directors, licensing advisor, coordinators, dean, and other staff in the School of Education.
- 2. There were a few classes that I felt like I didn't get much knowledge or guidance in. Some of it was due to irrelevance, but some professors also put minimal effort into teaching and it felt like a waste of time and money.
- 3. Mrs. Barbara Book's class entitled Trade Books was the best class at IUS and the one that I have referred back to the most!
- 4. I feel more focus on how to get an interview and navigate how to go about getting a teaching position after graduating would be very helpful. I struggled trying to get my foot in the door and even get an interview. I never was able to navigate through and even get an interview with any school district close to Louisville. I eventually gave up and let my license lapse and moved on to another career.
