 - Good standing within and completion of the degree requires 2.5 GPA average for the following subject matter clusters: Written Communication (6 cr.) & Speaking & Listening (3 cr.); MATH-T101-103; Scientific Ways of Knowing (5 cr.) & another science Content; Social & Behavioral (6 cr.) & Reasoning about Ethical Issue or Diversity (3 cr.).
 - 2.5 overall GPA for degree required.
 - Acceptance into major requires “C” or better in one composition, a speech course, EDUC F-200 with positive recommendation of its instructor, & MATH T-101; passing grades in a Social Science & a Natural Science course approved by the major; & passing scores on a basic academic skills test or alternative approved by Indiana Dept of Ed.
 - Prior to mathematics methods, MATH-T 101-103 must be satisfactorily completed.
