- Extensive, critical, and constructive student participation in class discussion.
  - Ability to do graduate level critical and analytical thinking, including:
    - o Finding, analyzing, and evaluating important concepts
    - Evaluating quality and accuracy of evidence
    - o Identifying and critically evaluating intellectual and cultural/contextual issues
    - o Demonstrating awareness of multiple approaches and their validity
    - o Developing one's own critical approach based on knowledge of the field
- Ability to synthesize information from multiple approaches to examine complex issues.
- Completion of individual graduate level written and oral communication of learning:
  - o Written papers that present critical and synthetic analysis of the topic
  - o Oral presentations that convey the central tenets and specific issues
